There will be no rest for **Jordan Mercer** after her stunning victory in the Molokai2Oahu Paddleboard World Championship in Hawaii.

The 17-year-old from Noosa Heads now has her sights set on qualifying for her second year in the Ironwoman Series before attempting the Coolangatta Gold on September 25.

Mercer stunned the Hawaiian paddling fraternity with her extraordinary efforts to conquer the 52-km Molokai Channel in 5hrs 22 mins and 31 seconds – 28 minutes ahead of her nearest rival, legendary Hawaiian

Kanesa Duncan Seraphin.

THIS IS NO CLAYTON'S COMEBACK FOR THE GOLDEN OLDIES

This month's prestigious Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Ironman Series Trial has attracted a host of golden oldies, including former World Champion **Phil Clayton**, and former Australian champion **Steve Pullen**, looking to turn back the clock.



The Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Trial, which will be held at Noosa Heads on August 27-28, will attract Ironmen and Ironwomen from all round Australia, who have spent the winter months preparing for a shot at the 14 positions available for the 2012 Series.

Clayton and Pullen were major Ironman players in the late 90s and early 2000s with Clayton winning the world title at Manly in 2000 and Pullen his Australian championship at Kurrawa in 1998.

But at this year's Aussies, Clayton at 34, not only made the Australian Ironman final but added yet another Australian title when he took out the coveted open belt final – described as "beyond his wildest dreams" in Australian Surf Life Saving.

Pullen, at 36, has been dominant in the Australian Masters competition in recent seasons winning the Ironman for Noosa Heads this year and playing a part in various medal-winning teams.



Joining Clayton and Pullen in this year's Trial will be 29-year-old Tugun duo **Tim Peach** and **Sean Kelly** who have both had distinguished Ironman careers.

"The way I went this year certainly made me feel like I still had something to give and coaching at Kurrawa and doing a lot of the sessions has given me a new lease of life," said Clayton.

"So I thought I would see how I went and the training has been going great and the results in the Queensland Endurance Series last weekend at Bilinga has certainly helped.

"Winning the 4km board race and finishing third in the 12km ski event is encouraging and my swimming under Denis Cotterell is also going great so why not throw my hat in the ring."

At the other end of the scale, Australian under 19 gold and silver medallists, **Tanyn Lyndon** (Northcliffe) and **Jackson Maynard** (Currumbin) will be among a host of youngsters sure ton keep the old brigade honest.

In the Ironwoman field, **Candice Falzon** has found a new lease of life at Manly, dividing her off-season between Sydney and Mooloolaba with boyfriend and KNG qualifier Matt Poole in Michael King's growing Mooloolaba squad.

Falzon and her emerging sky-blue team mate Devon Halligan spear-headed Manly to both the NSW and Australian Taplin Relay Titles last season and will provide the club with a two-pronged attack at this year's Trial.

They will be joined in the Trial by local Noosa Heads youngster **Jordan Mercer** who has just returned from Hawaii with the World Paddleboard championship – a 52km crossing of the famed Molokai Channel.



Mercer, who was in last year's Series, is one of Australian Surf Life Saving's emerging talents, who is quickly following in the footsteps of her father Darren and uncle Dean – both former Australian Ironman greats.

There will be at least seven male and seven female positions in the 2011/2012 Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Ironman Series selected from the Trial.

Trial races over a 30-40 minute M Shape course (swim, ski, board) will begin at 8am on Saturday morning, August 27 with a series of heats of 20 competitors with points allocated from 20-1.

Saturday afternoon will see similar racing (board, swim, ski) before the top 20 men and women progress to the Trial finals (ski, board, swim) on Sunday morning with the top seven finishes qualifying for the Series.
